

Equality Impact Assessment (EIA) Screening

An EIA helps to demonstrate how the Council meets its statutory Public Sector Equality Duty. It requires us to pay "due regard" to the impact of our decisions on people with protected characteristics in setting and implementing policies or developing services.

The law does not mean that no changes can be made, even if they have a negative effect on people. Suffolk County Council (SCC) is currently considering going through a Devolution process. This would give the council greater powers to make decisions locally and to allow the council to access funding aimed at achieving the additional powers. The EIA is for the corresponding Engagement and consultation that is planned to take place from September 2023 through to March 2024.

The additional powers will focus on:

- Education and Skills Funding
- Environment Policy
- Housing Policy
- Transport Policy

In addition, the council will have a new governance model which will include a directly elected leader.

The decision to proceed with the Consultation will be made by the Conservative Cabinet in the new year 2024.

Provisional timeline:

Engagement Phase 8 week – 16th October 4th December 2023

Consultation Live phase 10 weeks – 8th January to 17th March 2024. This will include a representative sample survey conducted by IPSOS MORI and an open consultation undertaken by SCC

Moratorium 6 weeks 26th March to 2nd May 2024

Data reporting phase 15th April to 7th June 2024.

Responses to the consultation once verified and sense checked will form a report which is used to inform the final decision. This will be made at full council on either the 11th July 2024 or 24th October 2024.

This process will be closely reviewed by the consultation institute as part of their quality assurance process.

The consultation is aimed at Suffolk residents and businesses. It is anticipated that business will be more affected and therefore more likely to respond. This group will therefore be of greater focus than in previous consultations. As of 2022 Suffolk has 31,000 businesses. 90% of these employ under 10 whilst 0.5% have over 250 employees.

Devolution will alter strategic policy rather than directly altering services for the end user. Later work at a more local level will impact users and we would expect further engagement and consultation at that stage. Therefore, the impact on service users at this stage is low, however further EIA's may be required throughout the process if devolution is rolled out.
